

How to get to Birmingham City football stadium

St. Andrew's Trillion Trophy Stadium,
Cattell Road, Birmingham
B9 4RL

Home to Birmingham City Football Club, St. Andrew's Trillion Trophy Stadium is where Coventry City will play their home matches for the 19/20 season. With a capacity of over 29,000, the stadium is located a mile and a half from Birmingham city centre and is easily accessible from all major road routes and motorway networks.

A traffic exclusion zone is in operation on match days one hour before kick-off and then 15 minutes before the final whistle to allow fans to walk to and from the stadium safely.

During the road closures, the bottom of Coventry Road by McDonalds onto the Garrison Lane junction on Cattell Road, will be closed to all traffic. Key travel advice

- **Plan ahead and leave more time for your journeys:** Check timetables and plan your route before you travel to make sure you arrive in plenty of time for kick-off.
- **Travel by public transport to avoid match day traffic:** The nearest rail station is less than half a mile from the stadium so travelling by public transport could be the easiest way to enjoy the match.
- **Be patient and expect to queue:** St. Andrew's Trillion Trophy Stadium and surrounding areas will be very busy, especially after the match finishes.

Travelling by train

The nearest rail station is Bordesley which is less than half a mile from the stadium. The station operates on home match days only.

The last train before the match starts gets to the station at 2.28pm and the last train leaving Bordesley is at 5.52pm.

Travelling on foot and cycling

St. Andrew's Trillion Trophy Stadium is a mile and a half from Birmingham city centre so walking and cycling could be a good option.

Bordesley rail station is approximately 10 minutes' walk from the stadium.

Birmingham New Street and Birmingham Moor Street rail stations are both within 40 minutes walking distance of the stadium.

You may want to use Google Maps to plan a safe walking route.

Travelling by bus

The main bus routes serving St. Andrew's Trillion Trophy Stadium are the 17 and 60, please alight on Coventry Road for the stadium. The 97 also serves the stadium, please alight on Garrison Lane. You can catch all three services from Moor Street station.

During match day road closures, bus routes in the vicinity of the stadium are affected one hour before kick-off and one hour after the match has finished due to Cattell Road being closed.

Travelling by car

If you are driving to the stadium please consider car sharing with other supporters to help reduce congestion.

From the M6: Exit the motorway at Junction 6, join the A38(M) Aston Expressway and then leave this at the 2nd exit signposted Ringroad. From here follow signs to Birmingham City FC.

From M42: Exit the motorway at Junction 6 and follow the A45 into Small Heath. Birmingham City Football Club is located on the left hand side on Cattell Road.

Car parking

There is street car parking available in the vicinity of the stadium and four official car parks on a match day.

A - Kop entrance off Cattell Road (B9 4RL).

This is open to commercial clients situated in the Kop stand.

B - Main Stand entrance off Garrison Lane (B9 4PP).

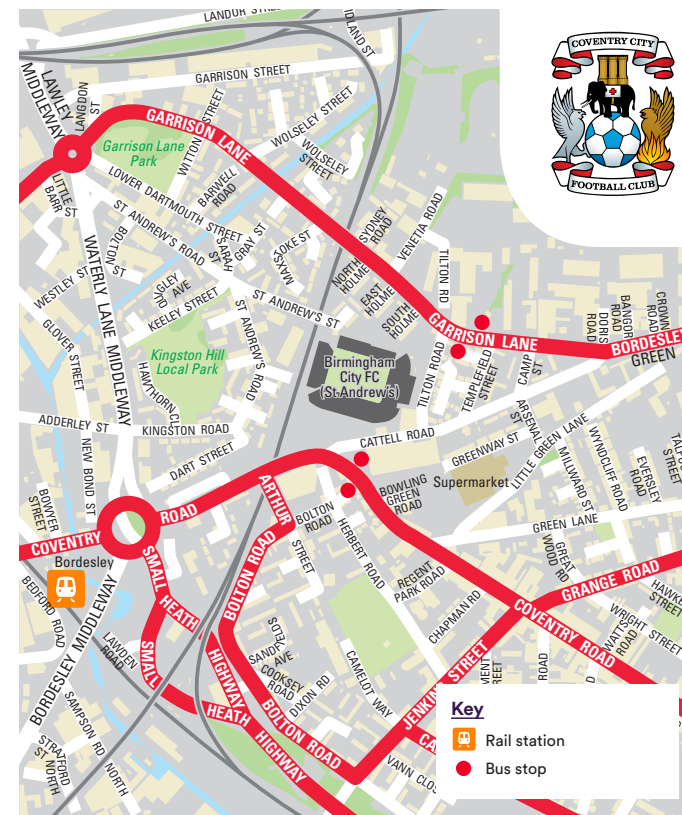
This is open to commercial clients situated in the Gill Merrick stand or Main Stand.

C - Century entrance off Garrison Lane (B9 4PP).

This is open to commercial clients situated in the Gill Merrick stand or Main Stand.

D - Bordesley Village School entrance off St Andrew's Street (B9 4NG)

£5 per visit payable on the day. There are only 75-100 spaces so please arrive in plenty of time as it is first come, first served.



Travel tickets

An Adult Return starts from as little as £2.50 and a Child Return £1.25 when travelling by train, bus or tram in the West Midlands.
